PRAYER—PERSONAL REFLECTION

When I look at the moments in my life where I have been the most patient, loving, kind, gentle, joyful, I recognize that it is only because I was sustaining myself in a close prayerful relationship with Jesus. When I start to get angry, frustrated, and just not joyful, I look back and see that my prayer was not sincere, not sustained, maybe not even there. Just like everyone else, I find myself forgetting to pray, refusing to pray, failing to pray sincerely. I find myself ignoring the scriptures, intentionally turning from moments where prayer should be offered.

My prayer life looks just like everyone else's, I'm sure you recognized yourself as you read that first paragraph. It's filled with ups and downs, joys and despairs, closeness and distance. The promise that I hold on to is that Jesus desires us to be close to Him. The Father wants us to know him, and the Spirit was given to us so that we might be able to engage more deeply in the mystery of the Trinity. Just like everyone else, I can go a day without uttering my soul's desire to God and if I let it go long enough, I can think that I am enough for myself.

I thank God constantly for those He puts in our lives to call us back to Him. Fr. Andrew and Fr. Edsil are holy examples of prayer in our lives, they call us to be present with the Risen Lord and they remind us that God wants to spend time with us, even when we're not able to be fully present. If you desire to have peace through the rapid pace of the life we live, I urge you to set aside time to pray. It may seem pointless and empty at first, but I promise you that as you lean into the love of the Father, Son and Spirit, you will find consolation, peace and promise.

Join me in remembering that prayer is about intentionally sharing your whole life with Jesus, the only one that can fully heal you from the hurts of this world.

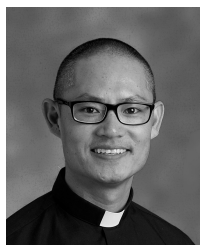
WE PRAY FOR EACH OTHER

A Message From Our Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Education is pivotal for success. Success is virtually part of everyone's goal. At the same time, Christians are called to be faithful—faithful to Christ's teachings; faithful to the integrity and good conscience that God has created us in God's image. Therefore, success and integrity have to go hand in hand. An individual who is talented yet lacks of good conscience and moral values would do more harm than good. 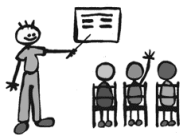
