St. Teresa of Calcutta – Saint of the Streets

It was in 1996 that we received a call from a priest friend, inviting us to join him at a mass with Mother Teresa and her sisters in San Francisco. We were to be there at 5:00am. We went, but arrived too late to share in the mass. We learned later they had to begin earlier because her flight to China had been changed. We waited outside thinking that we might be able to see her as she left. Suddenly the priest came out of a room and pulled us up the stairs to a small inner room. There she was, standing there ready to meet us.

Although small in stature she seemed larger than life, with a smile. After we were introduced, she invited us to touch her robe that had been made by those with leprosy. She asked us to pray that a home in China could be established.

In our discussion, Mother Teresa shared that the government of India was charging her for the use of vacant buildings. It was commented that the government shouldn't be charging her anything. Mother Teresa smiled. We were presented with Miraculous Mary medals that had been a part of her routine of meeting with people. We were asked to share these medals with others and to tell them to pray for her and her order. Needless to say Mother Teresa touched our hearts as she has touched many. We are still in awe of meeting and hearing her words to this day.

In 2003 our journey continued as we were able to attend the Beatification of Mother Teresa in Rome. It was said that this was the largest gathering in St. Peter's Square because of all the lives she touched. On this pilgrimage we celebrated each day by attending different liturgies in the major basilica's in Rome. Each liturgy brought out a significant aspect of Mother Teresa's life.

On September 4, 2016 we were again honored to attend her canonization. This pilgrimage consisted of the Presentation of her Relics, the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and a Mass of Thanksgiving the day after the canonization.

As catechists, we have been able to share our encounter with her as an example of compassion, charity and the great love of God and Church. We often mention that we believe she is the conscience of the 20th century and perhaps centuries to come. The deep compassion that she expressed for humanity is truly overwhelming. We need to hold in prayer the Missionaries of Charity as they continue her good work.

As we left to attend the canonization you were all with us. We thank you for your prayers.
