Many volunteer opportunities are available for individuals or groups such as laundry, meals, intake and overnight, driving, and medical.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we embark on this New Year, we are taking time today to commission our Liturgical Ministers who graciously serve our community both at Mass and behind the scenes. Commission is defined as “to send out with a charge.”

Commissioning is a special blessing bestowed on our ministers to empower, or authorize, them to do a special service in our faith community. Every person’s faith journey is different. Every person’s interests and talents will lead them to different places, and yet we are all part of the Body of Christ. Spiritual growth is ongoing and it is the process of becoming more and more like Jesus Christ. 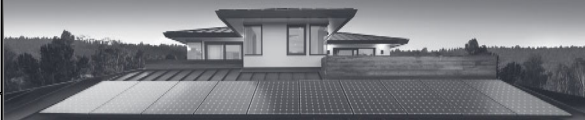
