COUPLE PRAYER

We rejoiced to hear Father Andrew, as his first challenge to our Parish, call us to spend “at least ten minutes” every day in prayer—but even more that he challenged married couples especially to spend ten minutes—just the two of you and God—in prayer. Ten minutes is such a tiny part of a day, and yet, without a solid commitment to daily prayer, it simply doesn’t happen, what with the busyness that distracts us in our daily lives.

For Catholics, the husband-wife relationship is something extraordinary; something that goes beyond marriage, even beyond the solemn vow before God that we call Covenant. As a Sacrament, Matrimony is *an encounter with God* in and of itself. As a couple, we are called into an extremely intimate and passionate relationship with God—to share all things in Christ.

But how? We can start by admitting that it is difficult, and asking God to help us! Next, by realizing that God is in our everyday gestures of intimacy: the good morning kiss; the kisses and “I love you” throughout the day; in holding hands when you walk together. (These can be a form of prayer, even when your spouse doesn’t want to join you in prayer; you can add a surreptitious blessing by making a sign of the cross on a shoulder when you share a hug).

You can find or create questions that speak to daily life, anything from “What was my strongest feeling today?” or “What do I appreciate most about you today?” to sharing a reading, poem, or song you love, and each talking about the feelings these call forth.

You can work your way into a more prayerful relationship also, by sharing prayers you know well, whether by reciting the Rosary together, attending daily Mass and discussing the readings, by choosing a few verses from the Bible and talking about what they mean to you, or perhaps by each of you choosing a favorite personal devotion and making it something you share with your spouse. All of these require setting aside time to be together sharing the essence of Matrimony—“just the three of us, husband, wife, and God.”

A Message From Our Pastor



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Good news! After months of hard and diligent work, we have been granted a permit by the City of San Jose to build our walkway and 18-foot cross. Compared with many other projects going on in the city, ours is considerably small, however, the logistics and requirements to get a permit are no less complicated than those of larger projects. After many revisions of our architectural drawing to meet our needs as well as to be in compliance with the city's code, we made it! We couldn't get to this stage without the help of our Buildings and Grounds Committee. In particular, with the diligent work of James Galvin, Rachel Garcia, Rick Bressani and Marv Luis, to whom I am deeply appreciative and grateful. Aside from the committee and those I mentioned, I also would like to express my gratitude to one of our parishioners, Annie Esget who also works for the City. Due to Annie's sincere and gracious help, we were able to obtain the permit the fastest way possible.

Our next step is to have three contractors do the bidding in the first week of February. With the current schedule and if all goes well, we should be able to see the meaningful 18-foot aluminum cross (on top of the vestibule—Church main entrance) as well as the Church walkway completed before Easter.

Along with this good news, I also have more exciting news to deliver. In the month of November, our community (parish & school) will join forces with "Village House" to shelter 15 "medically fragile" women. We will provide hot meals, shelter, etc. to 15 women who are in dire need of getting their lives back on track. We will host them in our Community Center from 7PM – 7AM daily throughout the month of November. Thanks be to God for this opportunity to serve our less fortunate sisters and thanks much to Chris Schmitz who graciously accepted my invitation to lead this project. We have a lot of planning to do and we will need as many volunteers as possible. If you are called to this ministry, please contact Chris via email at Chris@Waferprocess.com. I will continue to keep the community posted as the plans come together.

May our loving God bestow His blessings upon our community as we strive to be the beacon of hope to those who are in need by bringing Christ to our lives.

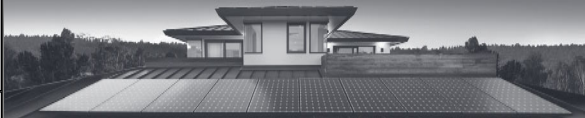

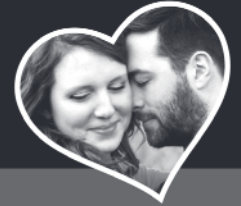
