

Trust in God's Merciful Love



Did you ever get to the point where you hit bottom? I did. It was after spending years searching for a way to fix a hurting me. I never thought I was much, and yet I strived to be someone. Even though I loved God, I did not feel that God could love me. In fact, I felt that if I had been born somehow different then maybe He could love me, but that I was missing some ingredient the way I was.

It took a herniated disk and my being in bed rest for six months for me to get to the point where I was willing to try anything to help me out of this darkness. This is when my friend, Sharon, walked into my bedroom with a book on the healing power of the rosary. She told me there was healing Mass that night in our parish and asked if I would like to go with her. My answer was, “Why not, nothing else works!” It was after the second Mass a week later that Sharon insisted that I get in line to be prayed over. When asked what my prayer intentions where I mentioned the names of several members of my family that I was concerned about. Then I moved away, and looking at the Tabernacle, prayed silently, “Nothing is happening, Lord, I have not asked you for what I really want. Will you loosen the hardness of my heart?” At that moment a warm wave came through me. Then a deeper wave flooded over me so I could no longer stand. For the first time in my life I knew how God loved me just the way I am. Back at the pew my friend Sharon was affected, too. We cried from joy all the way home. This healing was just the beginning. It is an ongoing process, but now I bring everything to Jesus and place all my trust in God's merciful love. Jesus, I trust in you!

Jeremiah knew we need God's healing grace, “Heal me Lord that I may be healed, save me, that I may be saved, for it is you whom I praise.” (Jer 17:4)

How can we say we love God, while ignoring those in need?

Depression is one of the concrete indicators that people don't feel they are loved and cared for. According to the Centers of Disease Control & Prevention, one in ten US adults are suffering from depression. In fact, some people that you know may be silently suffering from depression. They are in the crowd but are lonely and are feeling isolated. They may have families and loved ones, but may still feel uncared for.

Needless to say, more and more people are deeply longing for fellow humans that would truly accept and love them as they are. If this trend continues, we will be living in a very sick society, where people appear they are fine and not needing others, but deep inside they actually feel so much broken, depressed and are very much left alone to loving themselves.

Jesus in Matthew 22:24-40 reminds us of the supreme value of loving God and loving our neighbors as ourselves. Whether we like it or not in the end, we will be judged according to how far we have denied ourselves, and how we persevered in carrying the cross of loving and caring for those who are hurting, struggling, needy and deprived, which entails loving beyond people whom we know. Seriously, God wants us to do more in the area of loving the strangers, the exploited and those at the margin of society, which this Year of Mercy wishes to emphasize.

The command on loving God can be found in the Book of Deuteronomy. While the mandate of loving our neighbors like ourselves is reiterated in the Book of Leviticus. Unfortunately, in the Hebrew Bible the teachings on loving God and our neighbors are dichotomized and are treated separately. When Jesus came, the divine decree to love God and loving our neighbors were fused. Hence, in the new covenant, it is very ungodly to only love ourselves and to only take care of our own. In the same way, it is also very irreligious to claim we love God, when we are failing to truly love our neighbors.

It should be noted, that in the life and example of Jesus, loving God and loving our neighbors, was so evident. That is why Mother Church takes seriously her service to the poor, in the context of advocating and promoting justice and peace initiatives in the world. The recent, participation of Holy Family Parish to Tijuana Project where they built houses for the poor, is something that is highly commendable. It is through this kind of apostolate, where loving God and neighbor become truly imminent.

With that being said, those who claim they love the Lord must also make sure they truly love and care for others as prescribed in the Sacred Scriptures. Loving others is a concrete indication of our love for God.

I remember, when Mother Teresa of Calcutta received the Nobel Peace Prize Award in 1979, particularly when she said, **"How can you say you love God that you don't see, if you do not love your fellow human beings that you see?"** Mother Teresa of Calcutta, also mentioned Saint John, who said that **"Anyone who says, he loves God but does not show it in loving his fellow human beings is a liar."** For Mother Teresa loving God begins where we are and where people are in the present.

Finally, let us be inspired by the examples of Jesus and Mother Teresa of Calcutta to strive making the gospel become a reality in our midst. Because, just like I said, in the end we will be judged not according to how much we succeeded in our careers or businesses, nor how much we have gained something for ourselves. We will be measured out by how much we have denied ourselves and loved God and neighbors in the process. Let us not just be hearers of the Word of God, let us make the Word of God alive in the manner we live, especially in the manner we deal with the needy and the poor. After all, it is very ungodly, to claim we love God, while being negligent to the plight of the poor and the needy.


