## Communion of Saints

“What is the Church if not the assembly of all the saints? The communion of saints is the Church.” (CCC 946) The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) builds us a beautiful picture of who we are and where we belong and it leaves no one out. Again, the Catechism states, “Since all the faithful form one body, the good of each is communicated to the others.” (CCC 947) It goes on to tell us that the riches of Christ are communicated through the sacraments. As Christ is the head of the body (the Church) and all is communicated through the body, we must be aware that if one of our brothers and sisters is missing from our assembly, our assembly is not complete.

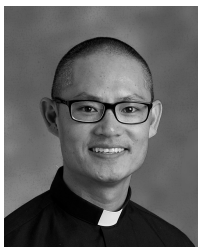
We truly believe that each of us has a role to play in the community where we worship, and indeed in our larger community we are brought closer to understanding the communion of saints. It is so much larger than we can fully contemplate; in fact, even when we die we do not stop being in that communion, spiritual goods are still exchanged between those who live on this earth and those who sleep in the peace of Christ.

Two Saints that the church can rely upon for their constant intercession are St. Dominic and St. Therese of Lisieux. Intercession is when we pray on behalf of another. When your child is ill and you pray for God’s healing, that is intercession. We can ask for the intercession of the Saints in any and all circumstances. But why would we even want to ask for their prayers? What good would their prayers do? The Church teaches that those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness. The Saints that have lived before us and have shown us a good, moral way to live desire to keep doing so even after they have left this life. They are our brothers and sisters and they have “fraternal concern” for us. Through that concern our weakness is greatly helped. We are strengthened to resist evil and to do good.

If you are curious about Saints, the communion of Saints, or have any unanswered questions on this topic, you can find out more in the Catechism of the Catholic Church beginning in paragraph 946 continuing through 962.

### *A Message From Our Pastor*

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As our festival team met and finalized everything, “Hands of Mercy, Hearts of Joy”, the results were very impressive due to the sacrificial work of so many dedicated individuals. The meeting ended with so much enthusiasm and energy, not only as everyone saw the positive impact of the festival team as we continue to build a more vibrant community, but also the amount money we raised. Although we may still have some unknown reimbursements that need to be made, it is fair to say that we raised about \$60,000, which doubled last year’s profit. The reasons for the increase of this year’s profit are that of those existing booths that are constantly bringing life and benefits each year to our festival. This year we had more sponsorships, a significant increase in profit of the Silent Auction and, above all, from the sale of raffle tickets.

Traditionally, we support our school with what we make from our festival. For at least ten years, the school has received \$30k - \$40k on average each year. Due to our prior arrangement: if we made above \$50k the school got \$50k and the rest went to the parish. Therefore, our school will receive \$50k as arranged. Perhaps, this amount is not much compared to \$3.5 million that the school needs to run yearly, but it is a very significant amount because the school has not received this much from our festival’s profit in years. Again, thanks much to our festival team as well as to our school’s effort in making our community all the more faith-filled and vibrant.

In regards to our festival, Jerry Lane and Chris Schmitz are the most experienced leaders and they have done such a wonderful and gracious job for our community. Not only that, but they also look beyond the current leadership and wanted to recruit and support our future leaders. Their vision and love for our community is deeply appreciated. It is in this line of thought that our festival leadership for next year has also been shaped accordingly. Our next year’s festival leadership will consist of a core team made up of Aileen Styczynski, Trudy Ehlenberger, Richard Racz, Chris Schmitz and Jerry Lane. This core team will equally share their responsibilities and leadership among the team members. They will work side-by-side with me in any hard decisions that need to be made. I am very grateful to Jerry and Chris for suggesting this leadership structure in order for them to pass on their experience and enable potential leaders to step up. I am also very appreciative to Aileen, Trudy and Richard for their willingness in taking up these responsibilities as new festival leaders.

May God continue to shower His grace upon our festival team, our community and especially our festival core team. Together, let us look forward to our Festival 2017 with great enthusiasm and love for Christ in building His Church on earth.

## Small Things Count

Did the wrong people win in the last election or did the propositions go the wrong way? Did you do your part by voting? What's disturbing is that far fewer than half of registered voters actually vote. That means that less than half of those registered—NOT half of American citizens—make decisions for all of us. Our faith requires us to exert our influence whenever we can in order to bring about just laws. We aren't doing that, though, if we leave the decisions to that small percentage of people. We have another chance in November. Between now and then, register to vote if you haven't yet done so and encourage others to do the same. Go online to the Registrar of Voters or pick up a form in the Faith in Action literature rack in the vestibule. Get it sent in. With vote-by-mail, voting is so easy. If you forget to mail in your ballot, drop it by any precinct on Election Day. Voting is not only an American right and responsibility, it's being a conscientious Catholic.
