## God Is Always With Us

My dad had cancer and was slowly wasting away. After work, I would see him and give him a massage which he enjoyed. My dad was not one to complain and all he would say about his cancer was, “I am sick.” One day after giving him a massage, I decided to spend the night. I had never stayed over during the course of his radiation and chemo sessions so this thought was out of the ordinary. Dad had a restless night. In bed I prayed to God that if he is not to be cured, then take him and bring him to his heavenly home. I said this and struck my pillow repeatedly in anger and frustration and then fell asleep. During the night, Mom woke me and said, “Dad is not doing well.” I got up and went to him and he died in my arms. I have often thought back on that night and at the part God played. Surely, He was the one who prompted me to stay so I could be with Dad and be a support to my mom. God answers prayers in His own way and in His own time. A mystery? Yes.

I talk to God throughout my day. I am, in a sense, a modern, American Tevye from “Fiddler on the Roof” who talks to God continually throughout his day. Am I indulging in idle chatter or in constant, meaningful prayer? I like to think it is prayer and I hope God thinks so, too. The words I most use in my prayers are, “Help” and “Thank You”. God has walked with me in friendship, supported me in my weakness, comforted me in my grief, given me His peace to calm my fears and rejoiced with me in my happiness. God has unconditional love for me. I am blessed and thank God for His continued presence in my life. He was even there with me when I turned my back to Him for so many years. God’s Son, Jesus, died for me. His pain and suffering and ignominy on the cross has given me a life I never would have known. I have been blessed in my Catholic faith, the parents I had, the people I have met, the friends that have enriched my life, the warmth of my loving family, and eventually the eternal life His agony has bought for me.

I can only explain my life by acknowledging God. I have seen God’s love for me in so many areas of my life. God has always been there with his love and grace to strengthen and encourage me in my journey to Him. God’s loving providence has guided me, enlightened me, called me, and responded to me.

There is a person I know who attends daily Mass so he can tell God how much he loves Him. I want to daily live a life that reflects the love I have for Him. With God’s help and sustaining grace, I want to daily have a conversion to become a better version of myself. Prayer is an important, indispensable part of that conversion and expression of that love.

## Catholic Q & A

### Q: Do prayers affect God?

A: It isn't so much a matter of changing God's mind as of recognizing that his providence and care for us include his awareness of our prayers, our desires and our longings. We are dealing here with at least two great mysteries. One is the mystery of God's knowledge of all things, along with his unconditional love and care, his faithful, unyielding tenderness in our regard.

The other is the mystery of man's free will, which means there is some way men and women work together with God in shaping their individual lives and destinies. Ours is a genuine personal freedom, not just a game of "let's pretend," a freedom which involves above all a personal relationship with God. It includes sharing with him our joys and sorrows, our hopes and disappointments, our wonders and our regrets—all of which is nothing else but prayer.

This is, of course, why Jesus urges us so often to pray fervently and why he prayed so frequently himself. What the heavenly Father plans and what he does depends very much on what we show is important to us in our prayers.

### Q: How are prayers answered?

A: Obviously, God loves all people. Scripture tells us that he views all of his creation as good, and this goes most of all for human beings who are made most like him in their ability to know and to love, to relate to one another as person. Because of that love, he always wants what is best for us.

Many elements essential to our relationship to God enter our lives with prayer, not least of which is the desire for the things God wishes to give us, desires which must be in our hearts if we are to be able to receive his gifts.

Did it ever occur to you that what is best may be different if we are praying desperately for something that if we are not? We are individuals, all different, even in our deepest relationship with God and the world. Our humility before God, our trust in him, our conviction in faith and love that something will be good for us, for our children whom we love, or for the people for whom we care very much—all this goes in to determine what is really best for us in God's eyes here and now.

This surely does not mean that we ought always to receive exactly what we want, as we want it, if we pray hard enough. But prayer, and that means above all a habitual prayerful attitude before God, affects us deeply so that we are not the same persons we would be if we did not pray. Therefore, what is best for us will be different, too, in God's eyes as well as our own.
