What are the traditions of your family each Thanksgiving? Do you gather at Grandma and Grandpa's house for Thanksgiving dinner? Do you invite all your neighbors to your home on the Friday after Thanksgiving for a special day of

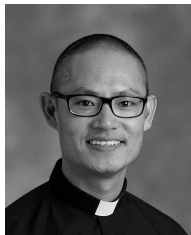
sharing and being thankful for their presence in your life? Do you all gather before the Thanksgiving Day meal and share the highlights of your year with a particular gratitude for what God has done in your life? Does your family select items at the grocery store and together donate them to the needy? Does your family give up their time to serve the homeless and hungry?

After a while, anything that we do regularly can be considered a tradition. In our Catholic faith, we have many traditions. We gather together and pray. We feed the poor and we share our resources. We recognize the importance of gathering together and sharing a meal, and as we do this we are remembering the command of Jesus at the last supper. Even though, in our homes, we are not sharing a Eucharistic meal, we are sharing a meal of thanksgiving. We gather together, we pray, we speak the words of our day, and often we recall our past. At the end of our time together, we clean up, we speak blessings on the rest of our day and we go out, strengthened. Though we do this each day as a family, when we gather with our extended family, our spiritual family and our friends on Thanksgiving, we remember something bigger than ourselves. We remember the community we are called to embrace, to love, to grow with.

Holy Family Parish has a tradition of holding Mass on Thanksgiving Day at 10am. We encourage all of our parish families to gather together to pray and be strengthened through the Eucharist before heading to your own separate celebrations. When we gather together as a parish family on Thanksgiving day for Mass, we also bring a food item that we will later have on our family dinner table and the priest will offer a special blessing on each of us, our food and our day. This is one way we can then take our Church to our family.

I encourage you to join Fr. Andrew and Deacon Ray as they celebrate this special Mass. Deacon Ray will be preaching, and at the end of Mass, Fr. Andrew will bless all those in attendance, and will bless the food items your family brought. I encourage you to talk with your family and select an item from your table together that not only reflects your enjoyment of the food, but the unity and thankfulness of your family.

A Message From Our Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Thanksgiving that we have come to celebrate as a national holiday dates back to 1621. The Plymouth colonists and Wampanoag Indians shared an autumn harvest feast that is acknowledged today as one of the first Thanksgiving celebrations in the colonies. President Abraham Lincoln formally made it a national holiday with the intent to call upon all Americans to ask God to “commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife” and to “heal wounds of the nation.”

One of my favorite holidays is Thanksgiving. It is the peak time—although we should do year round—for us to be reminded of the care and love of so many people who pour out their hearts for us and for the sake of others. It is such a life giving moment for one to truly embrace the true essence of one’s existence—to love and to be loved in gratefulness. On this occasion, I am sincerely grateful to God and to the Holy Family community. It is through the hands and sacrifices of so many dedicated parishioners throughout the years that we have come to this stage. This year in particular and in the midst of the work of our “5-projects”, I am indebted to our Buildings and Grounds committee; their hard work and sacrifices are beyond words. Thus far, we have finished two (speed humps & the main sign) out of five anticipated projects. The renovation of our Church main walkway and the installation of an 18-foot cross are underway. The Diocese has approved these projects, and we are now waiting to obtain permits from the City. If all goes well, we should be able to get these done in January 2017. As for our kitchen renovation, it should be done in mid 2017. All this gracious work cannot be done without our Buildings and Grounds committee: John Hesler, Phil Bejar, O’Neil Wright, John Chargin, Marv Lewis, Steven Sayle, Jennifer Robinson, James Galvin, Larry Entzminger and Rick Bressani who also chairs the committee; to all whom I am very grateful.

While we are thanking one another, it is essential to give thanks to God, for God is all in all, “Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his love endures forever. Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind, for he satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things.” (Psalm 107:1,8-9) Therefore, an act of gratefulness to our Lord is to praise the Lord with our mind, heart, and soul at Mass, for Mass is the highest form of prayer.

Our Thanksgiving Mass is scheduled for Thursday November 24th @ 10AM. I invite everyone to come and join our community in giving thanks to our Lord as a family of faith.
