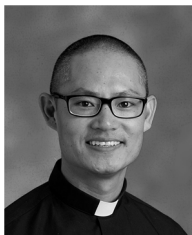

A Message From Our Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last weekend, we celebrated the first week of Advent which marks the beginning of our liturgical New Year—Year A. In both last and this weekend’s Gospel readings, Jesus exhorts us to prepare and repent for the kingdom of God is at hand (Mt 3:1-12, Mt 24:37-44).

As Christian Catholics, there is no better way for us to repent and prepare to meet Christ other than having a contrite heart in receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which is instituted by Christ for the forgiveness of sin. After Jesus resurrected, He appeared to His apostles and said: *“Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you. When he had said this he breathed on them and said, receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them. Whose sins you shall retain, they are retained.”* (John 20:21-23)

For one to receive the Sacrament of Penance, Reconciliation, or Forgiveness, one has to come to a priest to confess one’s sin with sincerity as well as the will to do penance. Priests are also human and they are also prone to error and sin; nevertheless, when one comes to a priest, it is not him who forgives sin, but Christ Himself. Priests are only acting in the person of Christ (in persona Christi), cf (John 20:21-23). The Sacrament of Penance is so beautiful for it requires one to be humble enough to genuinely acknowledge one’s faults and seek God’s grace. Above all, Sacrament of Penance is not so much about our sinfulness, but about God’s love and mercy.

Whenever we come to receive this gracious Sacrament we are coming to embrace a deeper level of God’s love. God’s love is beyond our sin. Thus, regardless of our sin, God will wash it as white as snow (Isaiah 1:18). How blessed are we when we have the courage to receive this grace-filled Sacrament in love and faith! When receiving this Sacrament, we are truly a new creation for we will live in the state of grace again. It is truly a wonderful and peaceful feeling that this earth can’t give, but God alone (John 14:27).

Advent is a season of hope; to await the coming of our Lord, who comes to give peace, hope and eternal life. Thus, it is necessary for us to prepare our soul for this redemptive coming. The ultimate way is to receive God’s forgiveness via the sacrament of penance. Only then can we truly embrace the full meaning of Advent for our lives will be filled with much grace and strength. Above all, we will be immersed in God’s love and peace and able to embrace the full meaning of Christmas.
