Joseph's "Yes"

We so often hear about Mary's "yes" to the Lord that we often forget her husband Joseph and the "yes" he made to God. This week in the gospel we hear about that "yes." Saint John Paul II makes a profound connection between Mary's response and Joseph's response in his reflection on Joseph entitled *Guardian of the Redeemer*, he states:

There is a strict parallel between the "annunciation" in Matthew's text and the one in Luke. The divine messenger introduces Joseph to the mystery of Mary's motherhood. While remaining a virgin, she who by law is his "spouse" has become a mother through the power of the Holy Spirit.

And when the Son in Mary's womb comes into the world, he must receive the name Jesus. This was a name known among the Israelites and sometimes given to their sons. In this case, however, it is the Son who, in accordance with the divine promise, will bring to perfect fulfillment the meaning of the name Jesus - Yehos ua' - which means "God saves."

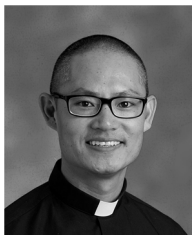
Joseph is visited by the messenger as "Mary's spouse," as the one who in due time must give this name to the Son to be born of the Virgin of Nazareth who is married to him. It is to Joseph, then, that the messenger turns, entrusting to him the responsibilities of an earthly father with regard to Mary's Son.

When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took Mary as his wife" (Mt 1:24). He took her in all the mystery of her motherhood. He took her together with the Son who had come into the world by the power of the Holy Spirit. In this way he showed a readiness of will like Mary's with regard to what God asked of him through the angel.

Sometimes, God grants us some serious clarity. For Moses, it was from a burning bush. For Noah it was in the peace of a dove and a rainbow. And for Joseph it was in a dream. It will probably look entirely different for you. No matter how you hear it, this truth remains: Whatever anxiety, fear, or problems you are having in your life right now, God desires you through the acceptance of his plan for your life.

This Advent, God is calling you to enter into communion with him, to accept him into your heart and into your life. What is it that you need from God to help you create this space for him? This week offer that up to him in prayer, whatever it is. Because as we have seen time and time again, allowing Jesus into your life will change it forever.

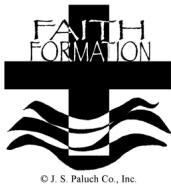

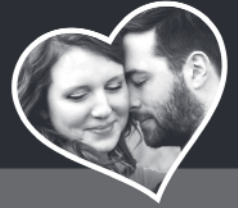

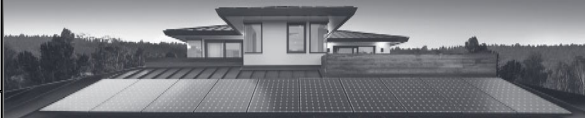
