Everybody needs to forgive somebody. Each of us, at some point in our life has had to speak the words “I forgive you” or perhaps you heard the words “I forgive you” spoken to you. What a powerful interaction that can be!

The Lenten season offers us a structured time in the life of the Church to do a deep and searching investigation of our lives – the actions or inactions we have taken, and choices we have made. It is a time when we reflect on our own brokenness and our immense need of God’s love and forgiveness.

This season of ARISE offers you the opportunity to go deep into the heart of forgiveness. Perhaps there is a person or institution in your life that you are struggling to forgive. Perhaps the person you are struggling to forgive is yourself. The truest way to find freedom is to seek forgiveness.

During ARISE participants meet small groups (of 8-12 people and one to two leaders) meet weekly for six weeks to dive deeper into our faith. Everyone, of all ages and stages in their faith journey, is invited! You are invited to commit to one season – but we think you’ll have a great experience and want to come back for more!

You are invited to be a part of ARISE in a small faith sharing group. In your group, you will explore how we are all children of God seeking to enter His loving embrace. As you journey through the Lenten season, you will come to discover that the resurrection of Christ gives us the strength to face each and every day through the freedom we find in Christ. May these words of Christ echo in your heart and mind: **“I have told you this so that you might have peace in me. In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world.”** John 16:33

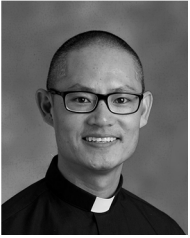
Church Hearing Assistance Device

A Message From Our Pastor



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Annual Diocesan Appeal – **“Proclaiming God’s Love, Together in Christ.”** allows our 1,000+ families to come together with families throughout the Diocese to meet the needs of many. **I THANK** the families and parishioners who supported Holy Family Parish’s 2016 ADA. With 600 families participating—we had an average pledge of \$397. This year, our goal is **\$205,000**.

Bishop Patrick McGrath has asked all 54 parishes/missions of the Diocese to work together to be a sign of unity and an instrument of God’s peace in Santa Clara County. Working together, our efforts, like loaves and fishes, are multiplied. Our ADA supports a great deal of programs of concern to us, including: faith formation of parish children attending public or private non-religious schools, training of our future priests and deacons, preparation of lay pastoral ministers, efforts to protect children and vulnerable adults, support for retired priests, and chaplains serving in our hospitals, jails, and juvenile detention centers to bring Christ to all.

I know many requests are made of you for financial support, but I ask for your help to reach our goal with each family prayerfully considering a gift of **\$350**. Some are able to offer more and some less; my hope is that each of the 1,000+ families in our parish will participate at the level of sacrifice to which your prayerful discernment leads you. As you know, everything we actually collect above our ADA goal is returned to our parish.

It is my prayer that we all share the joy and hardship together for it would make our lives all the more meaningful; particularly as a manifestation of our call to be Christ’s followers. Thus, I am hoping that we will have 100% participation in one form or another.

Let us pray together for this year’s appeal, **“Proclaiming God’s Love, Together in Christ,”** which begins on February 11 & 12. My prayer is that we will complete the appeal by the end of February in the same spirit as we did last year. Please review Bishop McGrath’s letter that was sent to you as well as pledge materials, and prayerfully consider your sacrificial offering and make your pledge this month. Pledge cards are also available in the pews. Thank you again for your continued support.

Catholic Roadmap

The BRIDGE Act, S.128/H.R. 496, was recently introduced in Congress as a bipartisan effort to sustain the temporary relief from deportation and employment eligibility offered to youth through the DHS's DACA program. Young people who came to the U.S. as children would maintain their eligibility to work and live here without the fear of deportation and family separation, if meeting certain requirements. Ask your legislators to support and co-sponsor the Act.

Support for the Homebound

If you have not seen someone at Mass for a long time, they may be stuck at home with an illness that keeps them from coming to Mass. Listen to the Holy Spirit speaking to your heart. If you feel moved, give them a call and check-up on them. Ask if they want to receive Communion at home (then call the office 408-265-4040.) Or if you're not one already, with training, you could become a communion minister for the homebound.

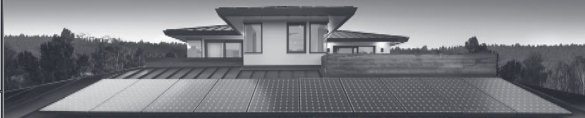
