Fr. Paul Jussen, M.S.



Greetings!

For those of you who do not know me, my name is Fr. Paul Jussen, M.S. I am a newly ordained priest for the Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette. I was born, raised and lived in San Jose for most of my life until I entered religious life in 2010. I've been a Holy Family parishioner since the parish relocated to south San Jose. In fact, I was one of the first babies baptized here in 1971. My parents, Bill & Berty Jussen, were very active parishioners. They were involved in all sorts of ministries but most famously were coordinators of the "Beer Garden" during the festivals. It was a "happening" booth! German music, bratwurst, and of course good beer.

So my history at HF dates way back. I myself was involved in high school youth ministry, bible studies, and confirmation. I've been on different committees and I was on staff for a few years as an assistant for the maintenance crew.

But God had bigger plans for me. I found myself really enjoying ministering to God's people. I discerned for a while for the Diocese of San Jose and even before then, the Discalced Carmelites. My vocational discernment had a lot of twists and turns which in all honesty was very frustrating. You think God is calling you in a direction only to find out it is somewhere else. I entered the La Salette Missionaries in 2010 and that meant leaving everything behind in SJ and moving to Connecticut. Five months in, my mom passed away. Then during my novitiate year in St. Louis, my dad passed away. It was tough but they were very supportive of my vocation and I feel their presence everyday which has helped me persevere.

I made my first vows in 2012 and moved to Chicago to begin my academic studies for priesthood. I made my final vows in 2015, ordained a deacon in 2016, graduated in May 2017 with a Masters in Divinity with a concentration in biblical studies and then finally ordained a priest June 17th, 2017. It has been a long road but I couldn't be any happier in my vocation! God has blessed me with such great people including the wonderful people of HF who have been supporting and praying for me. Certainly this couldn't be possible without the grace of your prayers! My heart is always with you. I look forward to praying a Mass of Thanksgiving with you on June 25th at 9:30am.

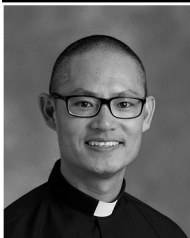

The Mass

Our Offering

During the offertory chant, the rite directs for the preparation of the table. Every time I hear this, I think back to my childhood when my mother directed me to “set the table” on special occasions. It was a privilege as each piece must be handled with care, each had a proper place, and each was placed for a particular purpose.

At each Mass members of our community are privileged to serve at the altar and prepare the sacred vessels for the presider. First is an altar cloth, on top of which is placed a corporal (a smaller square cloth with a cross embroidered on it), on top of which everything else is placed. Each priest arranges the sacred vessels slightly differently, but usually they take the following order. The paten, which holds the large altar host, is placed in the center of the corporal, near the edge of the altar. The cup or chalice holding the wine is placed on the right hand corner furthest from the edge. In our diocese the flagon, holding the rest of the wine, sits just beside the cup. The ciborium is placed on the left hand corner furthest from the edge of the altar. The Roman Missal (the presider’s book) sits off to the left, angled for the presider to be able to read from it while making the correct hand gestures.

We set the altar with special linens and sacred vessels, prepared reverently for we know they will soon hold Jesus.
