Not Mere Clever Myths

Today, the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, is a day of eyewitness accounts. The first, a vision reported by the prophet Daniel, was well known to Jesus and his apostles. The account was written in quite mystical and figurative language. It is a vision of heaven, powerful and memorable: flames of fire, burning wheels, the Ancient One, a Son of Man. Clearly, Daniel saw something, but was it a dream? Was it real? Was it merely a clever myth?


Peter wants no such confusion about his vision! We are told what he and his friends James and John saw one day when they went up on the mountain with Jesus. But that account is from the Gospel according to Matthew. In it the three witnesses are told “Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead” (Matthew 17:9). Lest readers of a Gospel account discount the story or simply write it off as a pious myth, Peter gives his own account of the Transfiguration of Jesus in his second letter to the church. He writes with authority, as an eyewitness. He reports this message from God concerning Jesus: “This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased” (2 Peter 1:17) and he assures us the message is “altogether reliable” (2 Peter 1:19).

A Message From Our Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Perhaps the name “Knights of Columbus” is familiar to many Catholics; in particular to our Holy Family Community. However, one might ask, “Who are the Knights of Columbus and what do they do?”

Thanks to the efforts of Father Michael J. McGivney, assistant pastor of St. Mary’s Church in New Haven and some of his parishioners, the Connecticut state legislature on March 29, 1882, officially chartered the Knights of Columbus as a fraternal benefit society. The Order is still true to its founding principles of charity, unity and fraternity.



The Knights was formed to render financial aid to members and their families. Mutual aid and assistance are offered to sick, disabled and needy members and their families. Social and intellectual fellowship is promoted among members and their families through educational, charitable, religious, social welfare, war relief and public relief works.

The history of the Order shows how the foresight of Father Michael J. McGivney, whose cause for sainthood is being investigated by the Vatican, brought about what has become the world's foremost Catholic fraternal benefit society. The Order has helped families obtain economic security and stability through its life insurance, annuity and long-term care programs and has contributed time and energy worldwide to service in communities.

The Knights of Columbus has grown from several members in one council to 15,342 councils and 1.9 million members throughout the United States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico, Poland, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Panama, the Bahamas, the Virgin Islands, Cuba, Guatemala, Guam, Saipan, Lithuania, Ukraine, and South Korea." At Holy Family, the Knights are represented by the St. Ignatius Loyola Council #12853, which was chartered in 2001 and is currently led by Len Piazzon. They are the ones serving our pancake breakfast at every first Sunday of the month in our Community Center. They are the organization sponsoring our student's essay contest and basketball free throw contest. They are the society that brings in the blood drives, coat drives & veterans support. They are our friends and fellow parishioners. They are the organization that our parish can count on in many ways.

Last week Fr. Celso Singson became a Knight himself and was appointed by me to be the chaplain of the St. Ignatius Loyola Council succeeding Fr. Edsil Ortiz. Please join me in congratulating Fr. Celso and our St. Ignatius Loyola Council.

Let’s pray that our Knights of Columbus like other organizations in our parish continue to flourish and helps bring Jesus’ love to our community and to those they come to meet.

One of the main elements of the Eucharistic Prayer is the thanksgiving. This is especially expressed in the prefaces to the Eucharistic Prayer. Listen to the words that begin each preface:

"It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, Always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, Through Christ our Lord."

They all begin in this manner, and then each different preface continues with a particular thanksgiving for either the whole work of salvation or a particular aspect of it. This preface is chosen based on the feast, season or solemnity, which is why it can focus on different portions of it.

The priest gives thanks in the name of the whole of the holy people. He glorifies the Father.

When we pray in our own lives, we should consider this part of prayer as our duty, even our salvation. We always should be aware of what God has done for us and to give thanks to God first.
