## The Domestic Church

Over 100 people joined us for our first Faith Formation gathering for elementary school families on August 13<sup>th</sup>. We focused our time together on recalling that each family is a **domestic church** – the church at home! The family is the first place where we learn for love, learn to say “I love you” and “I am sorry”. Each of our small domestic churches makes up God’s family – the world wide Church!

At our gathering, children and parents decorated small homes identifying the places where they experience love in the places where they live. We then placed all the decorated homes onto our large church as a reminder our domestic churches make up God’s family!

*How can you help build your domestic church? Here are a few ideas from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:*

- Begin praying as a family and reading from Scripture daily, certainly before meals, but also first thing in the morning or before bed. Find a time that works for your family. Use the liturgy of the Church as a model for prayer, and try to include heartfelt unstructured prayer as well.
- Pray a Family Rosary (each member leads a decade, and everyone shares intentions).
- Have a crucifix in a prominent place in the home, and in every bedroom.
- Make the Sacraments a regular celebration – take the whole family to Confession and Mass!
- Begin family traditions based on the seasons celebrated in the liturgical calendar.
- Make your vacation a holy pilgrimage by visiting the shrines and saints of our land and the world.
- Make worshiping God a priority. Never miss Mass, even while traveling – go to: [www.MassTimes.org](http://www.MassTimes.org). . . to find a church near you!
- Teach stewardship and charity to your children, through word and example.
- Demonstrate love for your spouse, your children, your neighbors, and the world. Remind their children that they are loved by God and have been given gifts to serve others.
- Talk freely about the presence of God in the joys and sorrows of your life.
- Welcome into your home and support priests, brothers, sisters, deacons, and lay ministers in the Church.
- Participate in the lay ministries and activities of your parish community.
- Allow your children to witness you in private prayer. Encourage your children to pray daily on their own, to listen for God’s call, and if heard, to respond.

Continued from last week....

Next, we have the institution narrative and consecration. During the institution narrative we hear the words that Jesus himself spoke at the last supper. The instructions tell the presider that “the words of the Lord should be pronounced clearly and distinctly”. Father will start out with “At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion,” at which time he will take the bread, holding it slightly above the altar and continue. When Father says the words of Christ, he will bow slightly, and when he is done he elevates the now consecrated host so that the people in assembly will see it, recognize the transubstantiation and briefly adore Jesus. After the elevation, Father will place the host on the paten (the sacred vessel that looks like a plate) and genuflect in adoration. He repeats this with different words for the wine, which becomes the precious Blood of Christ for us.

Each time Father elevates the host and the chalice (body and blood) he is doing it for us to see. So as an assembly, we together can gaze upon our Lord made present to us in the most common of materials, bread and wine. Next time you’re at Mass... gaze upon our Lord, he’s inviting you to share in his Passion!
