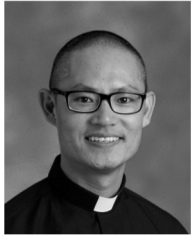

A Message From Our Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

“The fruit of Silence is prayer. The fruit of Prayer is faith. The fruit of Faith is love. The fruit of Love is service. The fruit of Service is peace.” - St. Mother Teresa

Indeed, prayer is the root of all virtues for through prayer one can discover the inner peace and many gifts that this world cannot offer. In our effort of promoting and living intimately with our Lord via prayer, I have continuously mentioned one should deliberately pray at least 10 minutes a day. As we start our New Year in God’s peace and love, we should also renew our prayer commitment for prayer is the breath of the soul.

While praying, we are encouraged to pray for one another. As usual, a basket is always placed in the church vestibule; one can drop off one’s petition at anytime into the basket. Everyone is encouraged to pick up a prayer petition and pray for that intention for one week. Once done, everyone is encouraged to pick up another petition and pray for another week. The process is repeated weekly.

While praying, first and foremost, one ought to give thanks to the Lord for all the blessings one has received. “Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18). Thereon, one offers prayer by praying the Rosary, Lectio Divina, visiting the Blessed Sacrament, etc. with the intention of offering one’s time and sacrifice for the prayer request. Or simply, offering any short prayers for the intention many times throughout the day. With our collaborative efforts in praying for one another, in expressing our solidarity via prayer to our Lord, we will indeed achieve the inner peace that this world cannot give, and not to mention the tremendous grace that God will grant according to God’s will— “...pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much.” (James 5:16)

May the Lord in His love and mercy grant our community of faith and those who are seeking God’s will the serenity as well as the eternal life.

Ministry in the Mass

There are many different ways that laypeople (those who have not made religious profession) can, and should, participate in the Mass. The primary way is by full participation in the parts of the Mass assigned to the laypeople. These parts include singing the hymns, the responses to the presider, praying the Creed, the Our Father, et al. To participate, one must be aware of the flow of the Mass. One of the beautiful things of our Catholic Tradition is that our liturgical flow is one that can be traced back through the ages, to the time right after the death of Christ. Once you understand the flow of the Mass, you can go to any Catholic Church throughout the world and experience the same liturgy, though with a local expression.

As an active participant, there are many roles/ministries open to you during or in support of the Mass. Some of these at Holy Family are: Altar Server, Lector, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, Hospitality, Music, Candle and Movement, Children's Liturgy of the Word, coordinating Children's Mass, Art and Environment, Sacristan, Linens, and pew envelopes. We will discuss a few of these over the next weeks and share how you can participate, if God is calling you to ministry in service of the Mass.
