COMING ATTRACTIONS

7/23/13 "The Burning Bed" (domestic violence) –NR – followed by speaker

Starring Farrah Fawcett. Based on a non-fiction book by Faith McNulty. Francine Hughes puts up with battering from her husband for 13 years. One night she sends her children to wait in the car and sets fire to his bed. She then goes to the police station to confess to what she has done. What did the jury decide? Come find out. NOTE: Kathleen Krenek, from Next Door Solutions to Domestic Violence, will be with us after the movie for a short talk and discussion.

7/30/13 "Karate Kid" (bullying) – PG13

Starring Ralph Macchio, Noriyuki "Pat" Morita, and Elisabeth Shue. A gang of kids who engage in an unethical form of martial arts torments Daniel, beating him up and picking on him every chance they get. Mr. Miyagi takes him under his wing and teaches him how to face up to bullies without becoming one himself.

8/6/13 "A Dance for Bethany" (human trafficking) – PG13

A woman longs for her and her husband to start a family. However, she becomes apprehensive when she learns about what is happening around her—children being taken and used in human trafficking. When she gets to know young Bethany Stevenson, who was taken into sex-trafficking at age 12, she becomes determined to help her and others in her situation.

8/13/13 "Last Will and Embezzlement" (elder financial abuse) – NR

This film takes a look at financial exploitation of the elderly. The problem is widespread and can happen to anyone, even Mickey Rooney. Such abuse is often not reported. Even when it is reported, prosecution is difficult. This eye-opening documentary presents several cases, giving us an idea of what to watch out for with our loved ones.

8/20 "Rain Man" (abuse of the disabled) – R

Starring Dustin Hoffman and Tom Cruise. Charlie discovers that he has a brother, Raymond, that he didn't know about. While Charlie is juggling his own finances, he learns that his autistic brother is about to receive an inheritance. What's more, that newly found brother has a talent for excellent recall and an ability to calculate anything quickly and accurately—a talent that Charlie intends to use.
